

Frequently Asked Questions:

What time are games?

Tee Ball games will begin at 6:00 p.m. and machine pitch will begin at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesdays. Kid Pitch games will begin at 6:00 p.m. and 7:45 p.m. on Mondays. Kids should report to their scheduled field 30-40 minutes prior to game time.

How long do games last?

Games will run 60 minutes for Tee Ball and machine pitch and 80 minutes for kid pitch games.

What equipment is needed?

We recommend all kids have the following: molded cleats or tennis shoes, glove, batting gloves, bat and helmet. However, we can provide equipment for players to use if needed. No kid will be turned away.

Do we have to purchase uniforms?

No. The KCUYA will provide a jersey, pants, belt, socks, and hat for all players.

How many nights a week do teams practice?

Each team will practice 2 times a week in April and once a week in May when games begin. Tee Ball and machine pitch teams will practice on Mondays and kid pitch teams will practice on Wednesdays.

Can we pick which team my son or daughter is on?

No. Players will go through a draft after an assessment. Once we determine each kids' skill set we will place them on teams to make sure each team is as even as possible.

Can my child play on the same team as their friend?

We cannot guarantee players will be on the same team as their friend(s).

If I am coaching a team in the spring, will I be able to pick the kids that join my team?

Coaches can have 2 freezes. The rest of the players will come from the draft.

We played last year and would like to change teams, is that possible?

Yes, but we will have an exit interview.

How much will the league cost?

\$25 per player.

We played last year and would like to stay on the same team, is that possible?

Yes. You can return to the same team unless you are aging out.

I have two kids in the program can they be on the same team?

Yes. They can be blocked together.

Is it possible for my child to play up a division?

Yes. However, the request must match the players assessment of ability. Once you are assigned to a team you will remain with that team until the end of the season.

What experience will my son/daughter need for the player assessment?

The player assessment is used to help determine their skill set and to give us a baseline to know where each player is starting out at. No experience is required or necessary.

I live outside of the I-435 loop, can I still sign my kid up to play?

Yes. However, players that live outside of the I-435 loop are not eligible to participate in regional or championship play.
